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Isaiah 30:15-16 - "For thus saith the Lord GOD of Israel; In returning and rest shall ye be saved; in quietness and confidence shall be your strength: and ye would not. But ye shall say, we will flee upon horses; therefore shall ye flee: and ye shall say, we will flee upon the swift; therefore shall they that pursue you be spoiled."

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Isaiah 22:3-5 - "All the rulers fled together; they are bound by the archers; all that are found are bound together, which have fled from far."

- Soon after Rabshakeh's speech, it looked like Egypt had come to deliver them.

WHAT DID SHEBNA DO?

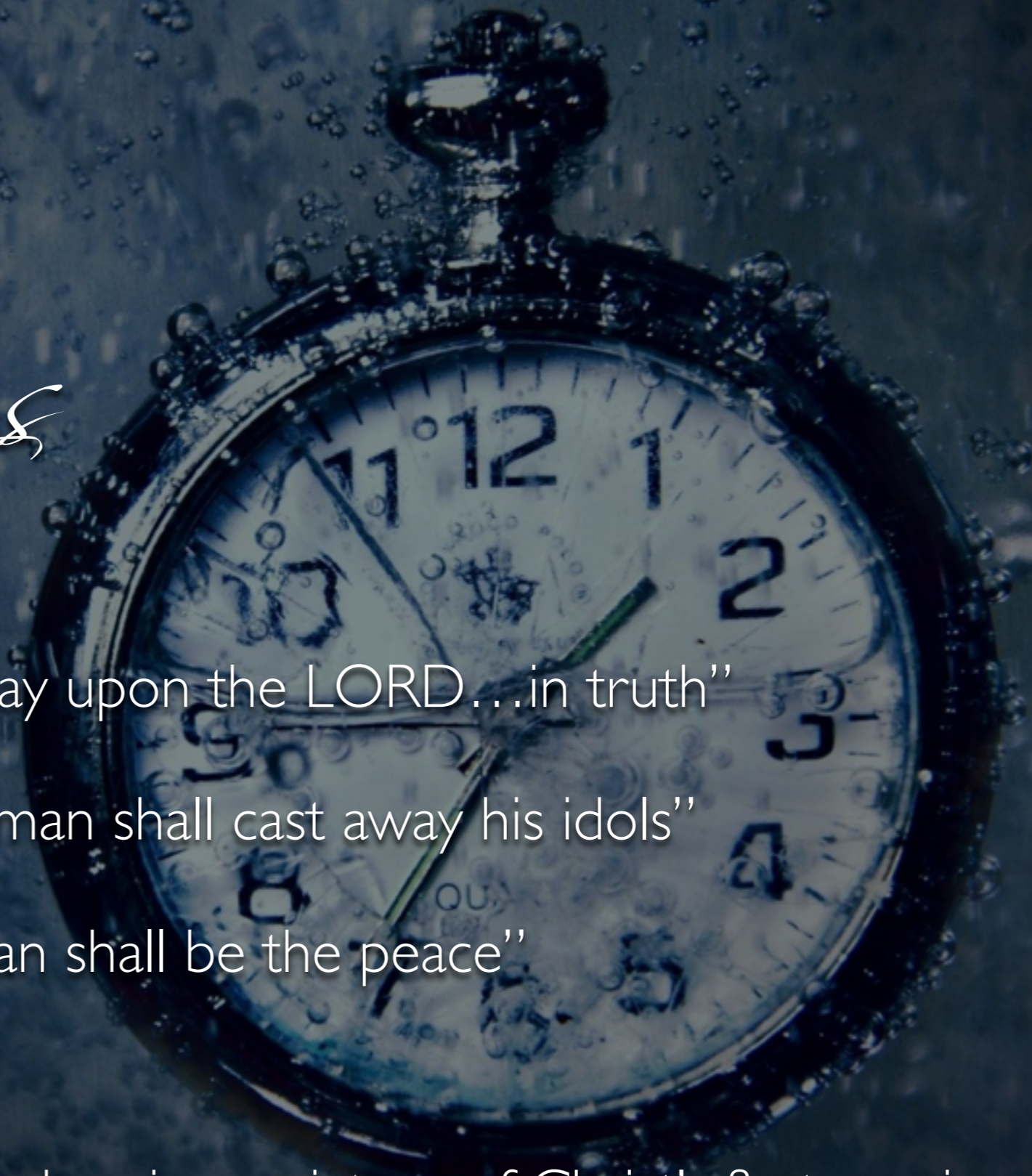
The Last Days

Isaiah 10:20 → “shall stay upon the LORD...in truth”

Isaiah 31:6-8 → “every man shall cast away his idols”

Micah 5:2-5 → “this man shall be the peace”

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Rabshakeh’s Speech Revelation 16:13

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- 14 - Prosperity in Judah

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As it would seem, “Gog” is the latter day Assyrian!

- 13 - A reformation Isaiah 13:1
- 14 - Prosperity Isaiah 32:27-30 Zechariah 14:14
- 15 - Gog Isaiah 35:10 Ezekiel 39:25
- 16 - Invasion Isaiah 28:15 Daniel 8:25

THIS INVASION IS ARMAGEDDON!

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While Hezekiah must have wondered why all of this happened to him...
This latter day Assyrian sounds very similar to the power that invades at
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...in hindsight we can see that God was painting the story of His son.

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Thus, Hezekiah's **whole story** comes together to show the Master.

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The Whole Story



1 - He was a child of promise, called "Immanuel" (Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:23)

2 - Many prophecies painted his work of deliverance (Isa. 41 - Isa. 53)

The Whole Story

3 - He entered the scene as a reformer (2 Chron. 29:3; Jn. 2:16)

4 - He brought the people into a covenant (2 Chron. 29:10, 21; Matt. 26:28)

5 - Sought to reform a nation that was oppressed (2 Kgs. 16:7; Jn. 8:33-34)

6 - Offered salvation from that bitter oppression (2 Chron. 30:6-9; Jn. 8:36)

7 - Brought "living water" to the people (2 Chron. 32:30; Jn. 4:13-14)

8 - He was upright before God, yet stricken (2 Kgs. 20:1; Heb. 2:14)

9 - He went to the gates of hell (Isa. 38:10; Acts 2:27)

10 - He was a child of promise called "Immanuel" (Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:23)

10 - But, he was saved from death and given life (2 Kgs. 20:6; Acts 2:24)

11 - Many prophecies painted his work of deliverance (Isa. 41 - Isa. 53)

11 - This life was given on the third day (2 Kgs. 20:5; Matt. 17:23)

12 - Then, he went up to the house of the LORD (2 Kgs. 20:5; Acts 1:11)

13 - After being given life, he focused on creating a "seed" (Isa. 38:19; Gal.3:29)

14 - Saw his nation invaded by the "Assyrian" power (2 Kgs. 18:13; Mic. 5:5)

15 - Many in the land were captured by the "Assyrian" (Ori. prism; Eze. 38:12)

16 - Those left in the city are just a "remnant" (2 Kgs. 19:4; Zech. 14:2)

17 - Brought that nation "peace" from the Assyrians (Mic. 5:5; Jn. 8:33-34)

18 - And yet, that "peace" was truly miraculous (2 Kgs. 19:35; Eze. 38:18-22)

19 - The people in the city then turned back to Yahweh (Isa. 31:7-8)

20 - And, the world recognized Yahweh as God (2 Kgs. 19:19; Eze. 38:23)

21 - This deliverance came in a year of jubilee (2 Kgs. 19:29; Isa. 61:1-3)

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24 - Then, his kingdom was blessed with prosperity (2 Chron. 32:27-29)

25 - Gentiles came to his kingdom to learn more about God (Isa. 60:5-7)

21 - This deliverance came in a year of jubilee (2 Kgs. 19:29; Isa. 61:1-3)

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Because God's thoughts are **higher** than our thoughts.

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Really, we see in Him the greatest example of overcoming through faith!

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And so when we look at the Lord Jesus, we see that he went through the same experiences and the same lessons.

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Class 1 Core: Our God can do the *impossible*.

Class 2 Core: He wants us to *remember* the past.

Class 3 Core: We live by *principle*, not results.

Class 4 Core: Only God has the *answers*.

Class 5 Core: He will *break* us. How will we *react*?

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As we learn the same things, we become like him.

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Really, that's why these principles are so important to overcoming.

Class 3 Core: We live by *principle*, not results. 1 Peter 2:23

Class 4 Core: Only *Christ* can help us. 15
They make us more like Christ.

Class 5 Core: He will *break* us. How will we *react*? John 11:33,35,38

They give us a relationship with Him.

Class 6 Core: His thoughts are *higher* than our thoughts. Luke 22:42

As we learn the same things, we become like him.


