Jeremiah 26:18 - "Micah the Morasthite prophesied in the days of Hezekiah king of Judah, and spake to all the people of Judah, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Zion shall be plowed like a field, and Jerusalem shall become heaps, and the mountain of the house as the high places of a forest."



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Reasons for timing:

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- 3 Hezekiah's words to the people reflect Micah's

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Micah's message worked.

Jeremiah 26:19 - "Did Hezekiah king of Judah and all Judah put him at all to death? did he not fear the LORD, and besought the LORD, and the LORD repented him of the evil which he had pronounced against them? Thus might we procure great evil against our souls."


























2 Chronicles 29:17 - "Now they began on the first day of the first month to sanctify, and on the eighth day of the month came they to the porch of the LORD: so they sanctified the house of the LORD in eight days; and in the sixteenth day of the first month they made an end.

16 years of filth was removed in 16 days!

Repairing the House

2 Chronicles 29:4-5 "sanctify...yourselves...carry forth the filthiness"

2 Chronicles 29:6-9 God's judgment had fallen upon them

2 Chronicles 29:10 "make a covenant with the LORD"

so the temple had to be put back together

Passover was a time to remember God's deliverance: Exodus 12:25-27





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
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
THE TRIBAL ALLOTMENTS

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2 - Israel had been faithless for years








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Hezekiah put all of that behind him.

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A Line in the Sand

2 Kings 17:8-10 - "And walked in the statutes of the heathen, whom the LORD cast out from before the children of Israel, and of the kings of Israel, which they had made. And the children of Israel did secretly those things that were not right against the LORD their God, and they built them high places in all their cities, from the tower of the watchmen to the fenced city. And they set them up images and groves in every high hill, and under every green tree."

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
