


Three principles that will lead our studies.



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
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Publican = tax collector

Then came also publicans to be baptized, and said unto him, Master, what shall we do? And he said unto them, Exact no more than that which is appointed you.

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Whether of them twain did the will of his father? They said unto him, The first. Jesus saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That the publicans and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you. For John came unto you in the way of righteousness, and ye believed him not: but the publicans and the harlots believed him: and ye, when ye had seen it, repented not afterward, that ye might believe him.

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And the sinners were even worse



GOING DEEPER

Thus, the Lord's parables dealt with these head on.

I - He showed that they were living in sin.

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- I He showed that they were living in sin.
- 2 And he explained that he had come to save the lost!

- I They didn't realize that they too were sinners!
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Thus, each of the parables about seeking and finding were centered around the Lord Jesus and his work of saving!

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John 10:14-15 he would give up everything for the sheep!

John 10:3-4 unlike others, he had a *relationship* with his sheep

He would have known the exact animal that left and he would have known its name!

THE GOOD SHEPHERD

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The flock represented Israel.

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Earlier in his ministry, the Lord had already declared himself to be the 'gBut, there was a problem!

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Galatians 2:14-15

But when I saw that they walked not uprightly according to the truth of the gospel, I said unto Peter before them all, If thou, being a Jew, livest after the manner of Gentiles, and not as do the Jews, why compellest thou the Gentiles to live as do the Jews? We who are Jews by nature, and not sinners of the Gentiles...

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One of the sheep had left the flock = An Israelite had left Israel!

In essence, they had left Israel and gone out with the rest of the world.

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
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RESTORATION







He searched for these sinners until he found them.

Then, if they were willing to come with him, he placed them on his back and brought them home.

he wasn't merely eating with them!

Those who came to him would have to make sacrifices, but the yoke would be easy and they would have help!

What about the 99 sheep? Luke 15:4 What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it? LEAVING THE 99

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Ecclesiastes 7:20

For there is not a just man upon earth, that doeth good, and sinneth not.

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Luke 13:4-5

Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? I tell you, Nay:but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.

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But, there are people who think they need no repentance—who think they don't need help.

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Luke 18:10-14 both needed to be justified!

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Luke 18:10-14

both needed to be justified! but only one realized it!

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Matthew 9:11-13

And when the Pharisees saw it, they said unto his disciples, Why eateth your Master with publicans and sinners? But when Jesus heard that, he said unto them, They that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick. But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

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Were the Pharisees righteous?

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Were the Pharisees *righteous?*Instead, this is how they saw themselves!

LEAVING THE 99

Luke 15:4

What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost, until he find it?

These prideful sheep would be left to die in the wilderness!

Thus, the Lord Jesus addressed the Pharisees' two issues.

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This parable demonstrated that they too were lost and that the Lord's whole life was dedicated to bringing back the lost!

Thus, the Lord Jesus addressed the Pharisees' two issues.

JOY IN HEAVEN

He would demonstrate the same two things in the parable of the lost coin—but the message would be even more poignant.


















At first, it might seem odd to say that the woman represents the Lord.

But, this concept isn't foreign to Scripture.

THE WOMAN

Sometimes, God is described as a woman.

Isaiah 42:14-15

Isaiah 66:13

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- 2 In the parable of the lost sons, the father would seem to represent either God or Christ. Why break the parallelism in the middle?
- 3 As we will see later, each of these parables represents a different scenario. Why would Christ say that he wasn't involved in this one?

SILVER COINS

Psalm 66:10

For thou, O God, hast proved us: thou hast tried us, as silver is tried.

Jeremiah 6:26, 30

O daughter of my people, gird thee with sackcloth, and wallow thyself in ashes: make thee mourning, as for an only son, most bitter lamentation: for the spoiler shall suddenly come upon us...reprobate silver shall men call them, because the LORD hath rejected them.

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Meaning, that they were involved in the ecclesia!

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This wouldn't have been the publicans and harlots.

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Like the lost sheep, they had wandered away a long time ago.

So who were the sinners that were lost inside the house?

Throughout Scripture, silver represents people.

And, these coins were inside the house.

Meaning, that they were involved in the ecclesia!

PERHAPS THE LOST COIN REPRESENTS THE SCRIBES AND PHARISEES!



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
